Natural Gas: Clean and Green Legislation Signed into Law

Press Release by Senator Gene Yaw

(Harrisburg) - The Governor signed into law legislation sponsored by State Senator Gene Yaw (R-Lycoming, Bradford, Sullivan, Susquehanna and Union) Wednesday, which clarifies how farmland is assessed for natural gas, by eliminating the inconsistent interpretation of the state's Clean and Green law. Senate Bill 298 amends Clean and Green to better define how the widely used program is administered and is set to go into effect 60 days following the Governor's October 27th signing date.

"This legislation is a critical update to how our farmland is to be assessed now and in the future. The development of the Marcellus Shale has changed how everything is looked at as it is a total transition to what used to be 'business as usual' on all levels of government," Yaw said. "All laws of this nature need to be scrutinized to see if they are applicable in today's world in keeping with the original spirit of the law and then changed if necessary."

The act allows for the development and use of Tier I alternative energy on any land use category of Clean and Green to be kept under preferential assessment as long as more than half of the energy annually generated is used for agriculture. Examples of Tier I include: solar photovoltaic, solar thermal, wind power, lowimpact hydropower, geothermal energy, biologically derived methane gas, fuel cells, biomass energy, and

Bestselling Author to Speak at Keystone Theater

The Bradford County Library presents New York Times bestselling author Michael Capuzzo, author of the book "The Murder Room." Capuuzzo will be speaking at the Keystone Theater in Towanda on Thursday, November 4, at 7:00 p.m.

In 1990, William Fleisher, Richard Walter, and Frank Bender formed a secretive cold-case investigation society named for Eugene Francois Vidocq, the ground-breaking nineteenth century French detective who inspired Sherlock Holmes.

Eighty-two of the world's greatest detectives meet monthly in a Victorian dining room in Philadelphia to solve cold murders over a hot lunch. It is the greatest private club of detectives ever formed, they come from 17 states and 11 foreign countries. They come from FBI, Interpol, Scotland

Yard, NYPD, the U.S. Navy, and the Egyptian Army. They are medical examiners, antiterrorism investigators, chemists, anthropologists. They are experts in every imaginable forensic field.

In "The Murder Room" Capuzzo highlights some of the Vidocq Society's most famous cases, including: The Case of the Prodigal Son, the story of how an investigators psychological acumen solved the murder of a millionaire's son who had run away to Texas and was brutally murdered by a manipulative girlfriend and The Boy in the Box, a fifty-year-old murder that made national headlines and still haunts Philadelphia to this day.


In "The Murder Room"

The acclaimed best seller brings true crimes to life while

delving deep into the lives of the cast of characters who make up the society.

Along the way, readers will meet and get to know

Frank, the world's foremost forensic sculptor, Richard, the world-renowned expert profiler of psychopaths and serial killers, and Bill, the president of the society, a former FBI and customs agent turned private eye.

Michael Capuzzo is also the author of the acclaimed New York Times Bestseller Close to Shore, a historical thriller of the true story that inspired the novel and movie "Jaws." Capuzzo is the winner of many writing prizes as a staff reporter for The Philadelphia Inquirer and The Miami Herald, and for stories in magazines including Sports Illustrated, Esquire and Life. He lives in Pennsylvania, where

coal mine methane. Yaw said the bill would restrict a roll-back tax to the portion of land filed under the well restoration report and land which is incapable of being immediately reclaimed for Agricultural Use, Agricultural Reserve, or Forest Reserve as defined in the original statute. "Farmers and landowners needed this legislation enacted to avoid paying roll-back taxes because of disparities in how Clean and Green was being assessed while open

spaces in Pennsylvania were remaining largely intact which was the original intent of the program," Yaw added.



Bradford County has recently purchased 20 Express Polls (Electronic Poll Books) with HAVA grant money. These poll books have been assigned to the county's largest polling precincts (by voter count) and will enable our Election Board Staff to process voters quickly and more efficiently. For example, poll workers will be able to look up voters who may appear in the wrong precinct and direct them to their proper polling place. The information will be at their fingertips and the voter will no longer have to wait for the poll worker to write down their personal information, go to a phone, contact the election office, wait for the information, and return to the voter with the information.


The Bradford County Natural Gas Information page offers residents detailed information about the developing natural gas industry in Bradford County and throughout the state.


