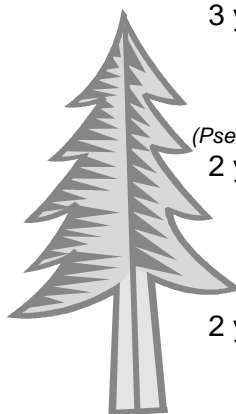

EVERGREENS



COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE
(Kaibab)
(Picea pungens glauca)
3 year 8-16" seedlings

Leading ornamental of the spruces. Grows to 100 ft., 6 ft. in 8 or 9 years. Creates colorful dense windbreak planted 6 ft. apart. Likes average soil and moisture with full sun.

DOUGLAS FIR
(Lincoln)
(Pseudotsuga menziesii glauca)
2 year 6-12" seedlings

A splendid pyramidal conifer. Rapid grower, hardy tree that grows well in a variety of soils, but does best in well drained soils. Christmas tree, ornamental, windbreak or sheared as a hedge.

SCOTCH PINE
(Lake Superior Blue)
(Pinus sylvestris)
2 year 5-10" seedlings

Beautiful evergreen with rigid, blue-green needles. A vigorous growing, hardy plant adjusts itself to dry soils. One of the fastest-growing of the pine family. Christmas tree, good ornamental, excellent windbreak.

BALSAM FIR
(Adirondak)
(Abies balsamea)
3 year 6-12" seedlings

Fragrant pyramidal evergreen with flat round tip dark green needles. Will grow in cool, moist, sheltered locations and swampy areas. Beautiful, fragrant Christmas and ornamental tree.

HARDWOODS



SARGENT CRABAPPLE
(Malus coronaria, Sargenti)
6-12" seedlings

A dwarf crabapple with white flowers and yellow green fruit. Grows to 10 to 12 feet and will tolerate moist soils. Excellent wildlife food.

BLACK LOCUST
(Robinia pseudoacacia)
6-18" seedlings

One of the best soil conservation trees. Fast grower and will grow almost anywhere. Erosion control, shade and timber products, makes excellent fire wood.

SWAMP WHITE OAK
(Quercus bicolor)
6-12" seedlings

An excellent wetland, plant which will grow in moist to swampy soils. Exhibits many of the qualities of White Oak.

SHADBLOW SERVICEBERRY
(Amelanchier Canadensis)
6-12" seedlings

A native upright, multistem shrub which is excellent in the landscape, wildlife food, or for planting in wetlands. Blooms white in early spring, producing red to purple fruit. Grows to 20 feet.

GROUND COVERS

MYRTLE (Periwinkle)
(Vinca Minor)

The hardiest of ground cover. Has dark lustrous green leaves and lilac-blue or white flowers. Grows well under shade and in areas where grass will not grow. Stays green through summer and winter.

CROWN VETCH (Penngift)
(Coronilla varia)
2 yr. crowns

Excellent for problem slope and bank stabilization. A fast grower, establishes in only 2 yrs. Space staggered on 3 ft. centers. 25 crowns to 100 sq. ft. Pinkish-white flowers. Plant in most well-drained soils. Chokes out weeds and never needs mowing.

SEED MIXES



KEYSTONE BIG BUCK MIX

High protein forage most effective in attracting deer for grazing. Seed in the spring or fall, in full sun and well drained soils. 40 lbs./acre or 1 lb./1000 sq. ft.

NORTHEAST WILDFLOWER MIX

An exciting new line of a mixture of 23 varieties of annual, biennial and perennial wildflowers selected especially for the northeast. Colors include white, pink, gold, yellow, violet, red, orange, purple, blue, scarlet, coral. Seed at rate of 1/2 oz. per 100 sq. ft. List of seed included in mix available upon request.
