1. Bradford County Leads in Natural Gas Well Permits.



Total number of permits issued for **Bradford County** equals **(3,608)**, followed by **Tioga County (1,822)**, **Susquehanna County (2,259)**, **Washington County (2,175)** and **Lycoming County (1,713)**.

2. Bradford County is one of the Highest Producing Natural Gas Counties in the Commonwealth.



During 2014, **Bradford County** produced **818 Bcf**, followed by **Susquehanna County (948 Bcf)**, **Lycoming County (533 Bcf)**, **Green County (357 Bcf)**, **Washington County (449 Bcf)** and **Tioga County (207 Bcf)**. **Bradford County** currently contains **(943) producing wells**.

3. Bradford County leads in Natural Gas Infrastructure.



Bradford County contains approximately **136 miles of interstate gas lines** such as Tennessee and Central New York Oil & Gas and approximately **764 miles of built gathering lines**. Companies have established over **twenty (23) Compressor Stations** to transfer natural gas to east coast markets.

4. Bradford County receives the highest disbursement of Act 13 Funds.



During 2011 through 2013, **Bradford County** received approx. **\$22, 719,364.50** and its **51 municipalities** received approx. **\$35,374,578.30** in Impact Fee disbursement.

5. Bradford County Jobs Impacted by Natural Gas Industry.



Between 2009 and 2012, **Bradford County** experienced dramatic increases in job classifications such as **Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction** industry increased by **1,016.7%**, or **915 workers**, during this period. **Construction industry** increased by **99.8% (539 workers)**; **Transportation and Warehousing** increased by **101.4% (646 workers)**; and **Real Estate and Rental and Leasing** increased by **600% (528 workers)** in terms of employment. Overall, from the second quarter of 2009 to the same period in 2012, **Bradford County** gained **3,357 jobs**. (NTRPDC CEDS, 2013)
