ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

AND NOW, May 19, 2021, upon consideration of the CDC and Pennsylvania Department of Health recommendations of May 13, 2021; and the continued presence of confirmed COVID-19 cases within Bradford County; and in consideration of the health and safety of the employees of Bradford County Court of Common Pleas, the Courthouse, court users and the public; and in consideration that the COVID-19 virus poses a continuing health risk, the Ninth Administrative Order issued April 30, 2021 is amended as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that paragraph 4 regarding masks/protective face covering is amended as follows:

4. All court users, public and courthouse employees who are not fully vaccinated for the COVID-19 virus are required to wear a mask/protective face covering upon entering and while remaining in the Courthouse in order to protect not only the employees of the County, but other court users and members of the public.

Court users, public and courthouse employees who are fully vaccinated for the COVID-19 virus are not required to wear a mask/protective face covering upon entering or while remaining in the Courthouse. However, such fully vaccinated individuals, including courthouse

employees, are required to comply with CDC guidelines and their supervisor's directives for such fully vaccinated individuals.

Pursuant to CDC guidelines, an individual is considered fully vaccinated: (1) 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines; or (2) 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.

All other aspects of the April 30, 2021 Ninth Administrative Court Order remain in full force and effect.
